Individual coaches will contact their team members. Cost is calculated each year by the # of participants and has been in the range of \$85-\$100 per season which runs until State Finals on April 2nd. All Students who participate should plan to be available on April 2nd for the entire day.

Did you know? In 2009-10, Bernards Township fielded 30 teams and each BT school was represented. Our students have consistently earned top recognition in the state and many go on to compete against teams from around the world at the Global Finals held at the University of Tennessee! Last year a fifth grade team from Cedar Hill placed first at Globals.
